Makes about 10. Costs £1.70 (17p each)

This recipe comes from our great aunt's kitchen. Simple but delicious.

350g plain flour

250g butter

100g caster sugar + a tablespoon for dusting 5 glacé cherries (optional)

Warm butter, add sugar and beat to a fluffy cream. Sieve over the flour and knead in.

On a floured board, roll to 1 cm thickness. Cut into rounds 2 cm in diameter. Place on greased baking sheet – well apart as they tend to spread. Press ½ a cherry into the centre of each.

Bake at 170C for 20-25 minutes. WATCH carefully, the biscuits should not brown.

Cool slightly; toss in caster sugar (biscuits must be warm for adhesion). Arrange on a rack until cold.
