LUNCH BOX 5

Chicken mini escalopes (serves 4 - £0.65 each)

400g chicken mini breast fillets

1 egg, beaten

1 tbsp plain flour, seasoned

100g breadcrumbs (2-3 slices, crumbed)

1 lemon, zest (optional)

½ tsp dried thyme (optional)

Take 3 shallow dishes and place the flour in one, the beaten egg in the next and the breadcrumbs, lemon zest and thyme in the third.

Place the chicken breast fillets on a chopping board, cover with cling film and bash with a rolling pin to flatten them out (so that they cook quicker). Then, one by one, dust in the flour, dip into the egg, and finally press into the breadcrumbs, both sides. You can do this ahead of time, putting the prepared fillets in the fridge until needed, on a baking sheet in a single layer.

To cook, melt a little oil and butter in a frying pan and cook 3 -5 minutes each side.

Serve in a bun or with potato wedges and a green vegetable. *The Dinnerladies*
