GUESTLING PCC MEETING – 1st AUGUST 2022 A VALEDICTORY VOTE OF THANKS TO RETIRING MINISTER, REVD JOY COLLINS

As you approach your retirement on 18th September 2022, and considering that there might not be another opportunity for Guestling PCC to express its gratitude to you, we thought it was appropriate that there should be a vote of thanks to you now.

We first had the privilege of meeting you in 2014 when you were appointed as curate under Robert Mulford's wing. You rapidly became a much-loved member of the ministry team and your appearances at Guestling became more frequent as you were permitted to "fly solo".

Much has changed in the Benefice since 2014, but what has not changed is the respect Guestling has for you. We have appreciated the warmth of your welcome at services, your concern for individuals and your ministry style and preaching ethos which draws from the finer things in life: from an appreciation of flora and fauna, shared by many of your congregation, to the lessons from the Bible which find goodness in personal relationships, and to your love of poetry. You have faced many challenges in the Benefice, not least since you were appointed Priest in Charge in March 2020 and were then immediately thrown into the confusion of COVID - 19 which brought with it rather severe restrictions on church life. You tackled these with energy and seemed to draw on the experience and organisational powers learned in a

previous life in local government.

We want you to know that we appreciate what you personally did to ensure continuity of worship by undertaking weekly you-tube recorded services, and by making the big commitment of publishing a weekly newsletter. These things kept us together and were a source of comfort and inspiration at a difficult time when what people craved was denied to them i.e.the comfort of attending shared worship in church every week. Your leadership was key. Of course, there have been other challenges but you have met them with resolve and now that we have returned, post-COVID 19, to some sort of normality in church life you must have been looking forward to a quieter period and the opportunity to develop the Benefice along your path. Naturally, we were as shocked as you must have been when premature retirement was more or less thrust upon you. No doubt you were looking forward to completing your

Now, as you approach retirement you should be aware that you have done a fine job at Guestling – and no doubt Westfield feel the same – and that you will be long remembered for your sympathetic ear and caring ways. Your legacy may be judged not only by the affection of your regular congregation but also by the attitude shown by: the many couples you have married here; parents whose children you have baptised; and relatives you have comforted during funeral processes.
